I have patrolled Hedingham along with several other neighborhoods in the area that encompasses New Bern Ave, New Hope Rd., Buffaloe Rd. and the city at large. I am currently one of three officers assigned to the Northeast District's Community Policing Squad. **The three of us will be taking care of various quality of life issues, crime patterns, parking complaints, etc. that arise from different communities in the Northeast District.** I look forward to serving the Hedingham and getting to know even more residents in your community.*

*On 2/23/17 I had the opportunity to meet with some of you at your last Neighborhood Watch meeting. One of the items we discussed was the **decrease in police calls for service in the Hedingham** area over the past thirty days. I was happy to see the residents that attended and was pleased with their dedication in assisting to keep their families and loved ones safe.
